Attendance Matters

- PSD has prioritized Attendance as an integral part of our goals for this year.
- Chronic Absenteeism is defined as missing ten percent or more of the academic year for any reason, including excused and unexcused absences, suspensions and any time missed due to changing schools
- Based on a 180 day school year, this means a student would miss about 18 days of school.
- Process will be to identify root causes for attendance problems based on data, and then formulating and implementing a plan of action to address.

Historical Budget to Actual

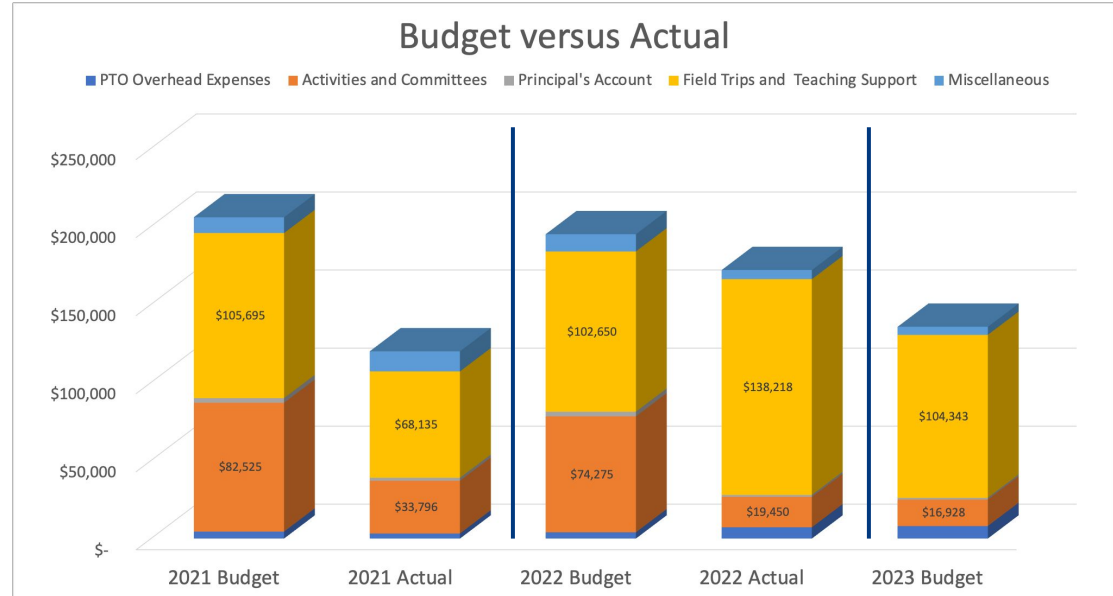
Budget Variance

- Fewer field trips

- PE teacher fully funded by PTO
- \$35,000 spent on field trips
- More family engagement funded by PTO

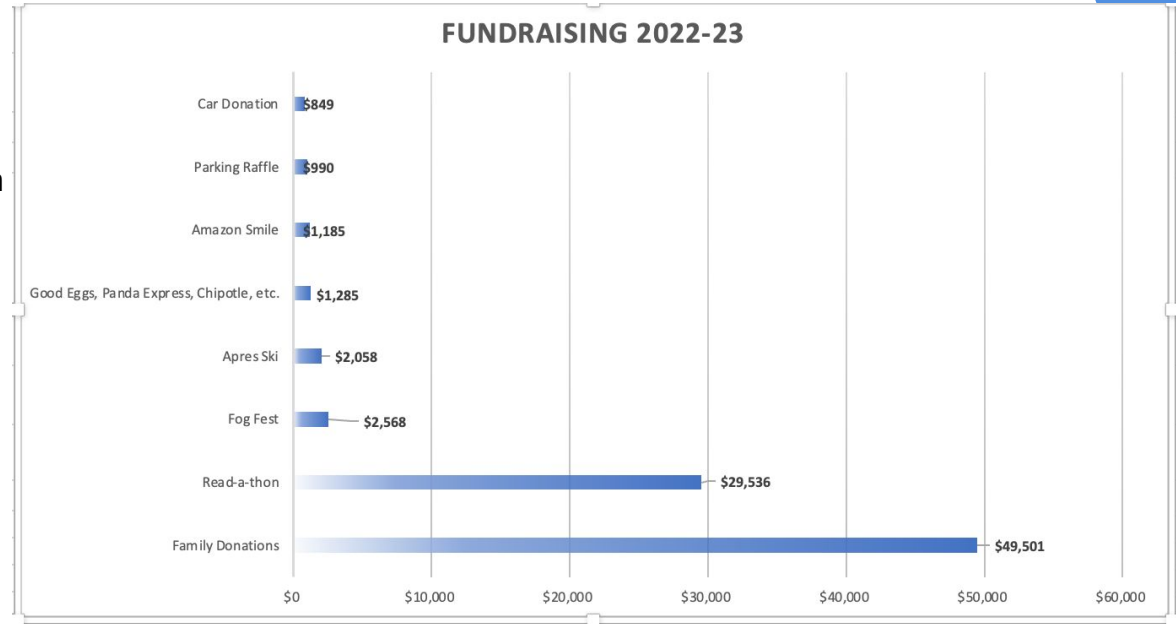


Fundraising Summary

- Fundraising totaled \$87,972 in the 2022 – 2023 school year.

- A deficit of \$50,000 was funded based on remaining funds in our bank account from past years

- We have a Fundraising Committee, but this is the first year we haven't had a Fundraising Manager.



Direct Family Contributions Matter A Lot:

If all families contributed the suggested amount (\$400-450/child), the sum approaches an ideal budget of 180k (our target although keep in mind we've made cuts to go with a 135k budget) with no further need for fundraisers.

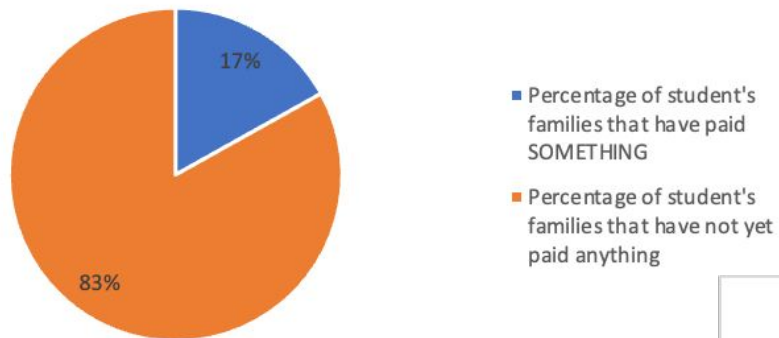

Licensed Psychologist and Gender Specialist Dr. Sarah Burdge and colleagues will present a summary of recent research about the impact of providing gender-affirming mental health and medical interventions to gender-expansive youth and young adults, and provide tips on how to analyze information that you are exposed to in the news or elsewhere.



Dr. Sarah Burdge

Common areas of concern include:

- Is my child old enough to have the self-awareness needed to make such important decisions?
- Will my child regret medical interventions later?
- How is overall mental health positively or negatively affected by medical interventions such as hormone therapy, "top surgery," etc.?
- What can I do to best support a child in their gender exploration?
- Are children *really* trans or non-binary, or are they being influenced by peers and/or social media?

As a Gender Specialist with a practice in Half Moon Bay, Dr. Burdge works with teens, young adults, and parents of gender-expansive clients daily.

What is PEF? Music. Arts. Science!



Founded in 2008, PEF is a nonprofit and 100% volunteer organization that provides funding and a commitment of diverse and educational programs which exceed California's core school standards that our district is unable to fund.

We ensure that all children in Pacifica receive a high-quality equitable education that includes enriching programs in Music, Arts, and Science!

2023: Launched TK-2nd Grade!

Elementary School Music Program at all elementary schools for all TK through 5th graders

- Funds teacher salaries, new instruments, and repairs

Elementary School Slam Poetry Program (SPARC: Stage Performance + Rhythmic Culture - Poetry) at all five elementary schools for all 5th graders.

- Funds for instructors, program supplies, and poetry event expenses

Middle School Band Program (Music Matters in Pacifica - MMIP) at IBL, Cabrillo, Vallemar, and OSS

- Funds sheet music, venue rental, instrument purchase, repairs, and more

Middle School Computer Science Program at IBL, Cabrillo, Vallemar, and OSS

- Funded digital devices for students
- Starting in 2018, we funded professional development and training for teachers to select and roll-out a science curriculum supporting the State of California's Next Generation Science Standards

Why Do We Need PEF?

Our School District Has Funding Challenges:

- **Pacifica is at the bottom** of the San Mateo County budget barrel
- A whopping **\$21K gap**, per student!
- 40th in the nation: CA per student taxable income directed to Dept. of EDU.

PEF bridges the gap where the nation, the state, and our district, fall short.

DO park on surrounding neighborhood streets in normal legal parking spots



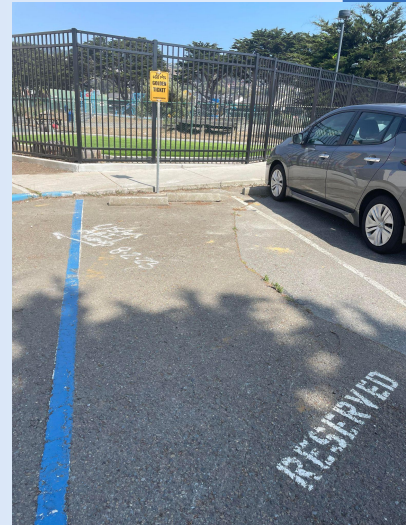
DO NOT park in staff parking lot (by front entrance behind ACE hardware)
